What is Early College of Allegan County?

Also known as ECAC is a 3-year program that allows stu5dents to complete high school requirements and earn up to 62 transferrable college credits through our college partner, Lake Michigan College (LMC).

All students accepted into the program enroll in college coursework during grade 11. They choose one program of study. This determines the courses in which they enroll.

The Arts & Science Associate's which is a general transfer degree that is equivalent to the first two years of a bachelor's degree.

The Associate's of Business provides students with a background in areas such as finance, marketing, sales, customer service, and professional communication.

Getting Started

10th Grade-

Complete Application process and applicant will be notified in April if they have been selected.

College Summer Success Bootcamp-5 days spread throughout Summer before 11th grade.

11th Grade-9 college credits/semester

Take college classes $\frac{1}{2}$ day taught by Lake Michigan College instructors and $\frac{1}{2}$ day at your high school. Participation in extra-curricular activities is allowed.

12th Grade-10 credits & 9 credits/semester

Take college classes ½ day taught by Lake Michigan College instructors and ½ day at your high school. Participate in "Senior" activities and commencement. (Student has not yet graduated so student can attend 13th year)

13th Grade-Full time student with 12-15 credits/semester

Students must take one class required for their high school diploma, either Math or Economics.
